



2010 Legislative Scorecard

This legislative session, Planned Parenthood fought diligently for the reproductive rights of all Arizonans. There was commonsense legislation offered that addressed fundamental health care needs, only to have it mischaracterized and rejected by anti-choice legislators.

Legislation we supported:

- ✓ **HB 2747-** This bill would have required hospitals to provide Emergency Contraception (EC) to sexual assault survivors in the emergency room; recognized the duty of pharmacies and providers to stock and dispense EC, and provided for an awareness program to educate Arizonans about EC. **No action was taken on this bill.**
- ✓ **HB 2361 –** This bill would have required all schools to provide sex education that is "medically accurate" and "comprehensive." **No action was taken on this bill.**



Legislation we opposed:

- ◆ **SB 1304** - This bill significantly expands the reporting requirements regarding abortion care and could include reporting the specific reason why a woman may have chosen to have an elective abortion, violating her privacy. **This bill was signed into law 4/21/10.**
- ◆ **SB 1305** - This bill discriminates against women regarding their health insurance benefits. It prohibits any public entity from providing health insurance coverage for abortion care as part of an employee's health care benefits package. It also forbids any Arizona health plans offered through a state health exchange from including coverage for abortions unless that coverage is offered as a separate optional rider with an additional premium. SB 1305 includes an exception **ONLY** if the procedure saves the life of the woman or will "avert substantial and irreversible impairment of a major bodily function," but **DOES NOT INCLUDE EXCEPTIONS** for a pregnancy resulting from rape or incest. **This bill was signed into law 4/24/10.**
- ◆ **SB 1309** - This bill has enacted sweeping changes to laws that protect the health and safety of young people in Arizona. Labeled a "parent's rights" bill, this proposal puts young people in troubled homes at risk by limiting their ability to safely seek medical care. It also ties the hands of school districts by making it almost impossible for schools to teach life-saving health curricula, including sexuality education. SB 1309, as amended, will mandate decision making that should be left to parents, guardians, and trusted healthcare professionals and create additional burdens for parents. **This bill was signed into law 5/10/10.**
